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| Q1 | How do we teach or guide the p2 students to memorise or learn multiplication? Is there a simpler way than to memorise the numbers? |
| A | There are songs to learn the multiplication tables. The teachers will teach the students. If you are interested in the songs, please contact your child's Maths teacher. |
| Q2 | What is the difference between Olympiad Training (P4-6) Singapore and Asian Schools Maths Olympiads (P3-6)? |
| A | Our school invites external trainers to conduct Maths Olympiad training (MOT) for selected P4 to P6 students. These are extra after school enrichment lessons. Singapore and Asian Schools Maths Olympiads (SASMO) is a competition for selected P3 to P6 students. |
| Q3 | With respect to Singapore and Asian Schools Math Olympiads , can it be started from P2 instead of P3 ? As P2 students do not have exams they have more time to learn through Olympiad which paves way to perform mathematics better in upper primary. |

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| Q4 | As part of CCA , is there feasibility of introducing chess ? |
| A | We will continue to review the CCAs offered in Junyuan Primary School. For now, there are no plans to introduce Chess. |
