### P6 Preliminary Examination Matters

#### Absence from Examinations

If a student is absent for any paper or subject during the P6 Preliminary Examinations, his/her absence will need to be supported with a Medical Certificate from the doctor. Letters from parents with official supporting documents will be accepted as valid reasons for absence.

Students should not be encouraged to come to school to sit for the examination if they are unwell or have been certified by a doctor to be unfit for attendance in school. This is consistent with MOH's guideline and for parents to exercise personal responsibility. A student who is unwell will also not perform at his/her best.

Once the student returns to school, the subject teacher will arrange for him/her to sit for the paper for the purpose of revision and practice. The teacher will mark the paper and give the student feedback on his/her performance. The marks for the paper will not be included in the overall results at the end of the year. However, students who are absent for the EL or MT Oral Examinations will be able to sit for the papers on the designated oral make-up day and their marks will count towards their final total.

## Racial Harmony Day

The school will be commemorating Racial Harmony Day (RHD), which marks the anniversary of the 1964 Riots during Term 3 Week 4. The theme for this year's RHD is ***Our Multicultural Mosaic***.

The theme reflects how each community, while having the space to express its own identity as part of Singapore society, also intertwines with others to depict the unique cultural diversity that characterises Singapore life. The overall picture may change with time as our society evolves, like all societies do, but the hues will continue to complement one another because of our long-shared history and heritage. This is Singapore's bespoke approach towards multiculturalism and social cohesion, where the experiences of every individual matter and add to our diversity.

Besides class activities during CCE (FTGP) lessons, our students will also be engaged in fringe activities during recess. Through these activities to appreciate the multicultural identity of Singapore, we seek to help our students apply the theme in their lives, to explore what it means to strengthen cohesion amongst communities, and to take action to preserve racial harmony in Singapore.

On **Thursday, 20 July 2023**, our students are encouraged to come to school dressed in ethnic costumes representing the four main ethnic groups so that they grow in appreciation and understanding of the different cultures; and strengthen the collective identity of Singaporeans. **Do note that with the ethnic attire, accompanying hair accessories must still be worn in accordance with the school rules and safety rules. Hence, school shoes should be worn too.**

## Safety Reminders

### Road Safety and Regulations

During the school dismissal, we noticed parents/guardians,

- 1) queue and wait in their cars along Tampines Ave 4 Road for their children before/during the school dismissal. The long queue formed along the Tampines Ave 4 Road caused traffic congestion, resulting public buses not able to drive into the bus bay of the bus stop near the bridge (outside Side Gate 2).
- 2) wait for their children on the overhead bridge. This caused human congestion and obstruction to other users using the overhead bridge, resulting others not able to use the bridge safely.



We would like to remind parents to be considerate road users, and mindful of road safety and regulations.

To cultivate students' interest in reading, the Library committee will be organising lots of fun and interesting activities during our Library Week.
